



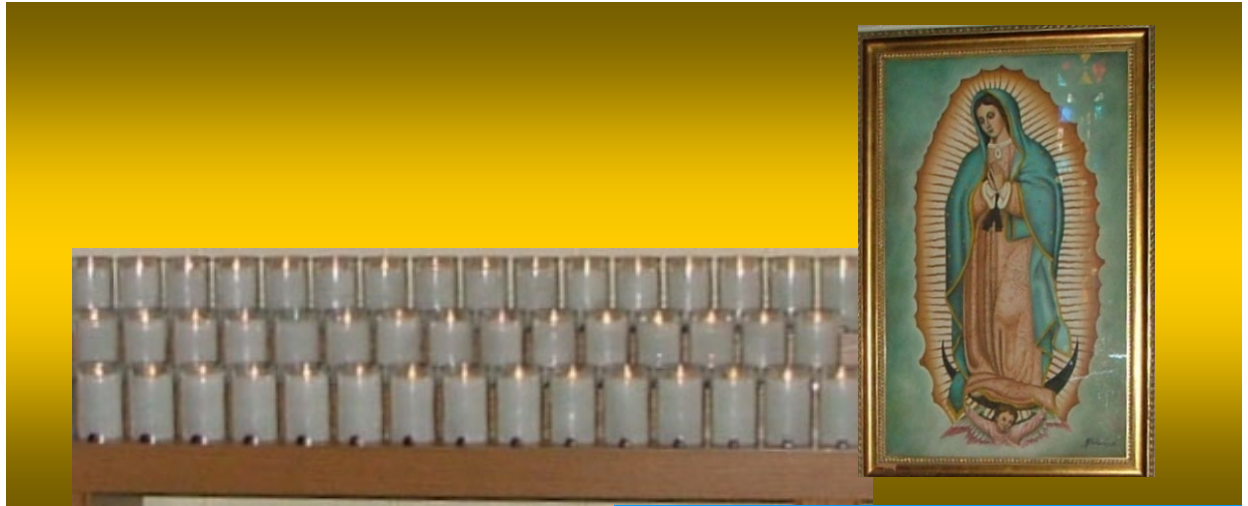

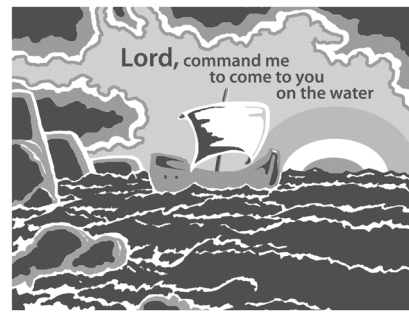

Deacon Jose Prado

On Monday August 4, 2014 Deacon Jose Prado passed away to eternity. He was 95. He had a peaceful death. He received all the sacraments and died surrounded by his family and friends. I was called to his bedside on Sunday evening. We anointed him with the Holy oil and said the prayers for the dying. He is survived by his eight children, fifteen grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.

Deacon Prado was one of the first deacons in the Diocese of Oakland. He served at Holy Rosary Church in Union City and later on came to serve at Saint Felicitas Church. At Saint Felicitas Church he worked hard especially with the Hispanic community. He was very involved in the Spanish Mass and other events related to the Spanish community.

Before becoming a deacon he served in the United States Air Force and served in France, England and the Azores. He also worked for the VA.

He is remembered as a very compassionate and caring person. He did much to care for troubled people, often giving them shelter in his own house. He also helped with food for the poor. As one of his daughters said, his life can be summed up from the book of Ecclesiastes: "...there is nothing better for people than to be happy and to do good while they live (Eccl.3:112)."

What is in lighting a candle?

Lighting a candle has meaning only when attached to sacrifice. As a candle burns itself out in the giving of the light, so our donation is meant to be a sacrificial offering to God to express our love and prayers.

PLEASE LIGHT ONLY ONE CANDLE TO EMBRACE ALL YOUR INTENTIONS.

No Fire Please

Kindly do not bring any fire or materials for making fire into the candle room. Consequently, it is not allowed to bring matches, lighters or wax candles into the candle room. **Please do not bring flowers into the candle room as well.** In case anyone notices people bringing wax candles/flowers into the room kindly remind them that it is not permitted.

How to light the electric candle?

Each candle has a switch in front of it. Please press and hold the switch for a second or so to light the candle. Once you light the candle it is controlled by a computer chip. You are not able to turn it off manually!

Donations for lighting the candle

We will notice two types of candles in the room - large ones and small ones. The large ones are white in color and the small ones come in two colors, red or blue. Donation for lighting large candle (white in color) is \$3; it burns for three full days. Donation to light the small candle (red or blue) is \$1; it burns for a full day.

Transitions are always fraught with difficulties. We pray that everyone gets used to the change gradually with peace and joy. May our devotions continue to grow and help us in our spiritual growth.

Our *Reclaiming Christ's Mission Together* Campaign Begins!

As a diocesan faith family, we celebrate the recent appointment of our fifth Bishop, the Most Reverend Michael C. Barber, S.J. After much thought, prayer, and consultation with his priests and other advisors, Bishop Barber has made the decision to lead the faithful in an ambitious endeavor to provide the means for the Diocese to strengthen and stabilize the Diocese's long-term financial footing, increase funding for parish projects and needs, and to demonstrate sound stewardship over the gifts the Diocese has already received.

The faithful of the Diocese are being invited to join Bishop Barber in the *Reclaiming Christ's Mission Together* Campaign. The funds raised in this first-ever diocesan wide campaign will generate the financial means needed to further our mission throughout the East Bay and secure a solid financial foundation for our future.
